As you may know, it has been roughly two years since the first Strategic Planning meetings that ultimately resulted in the ongoing restaurant renovation process at Kiln Creek Golf Club & Resort. A number of residents, Directors, and staff members participated on the committee that resulted in a design that accommodated several existing demands while at the same time adding several new revenue streams. The new project, NEST Kitchen & Taphouse, will open this winter, and it will prove to be a terrific new benefit to both the business and the community as a whole.

The need to renovate the Club's aging restaurant became more and more clear as major equipment, much of it nearly 30 years old, began to fail and required replacement. What's more, due to the limitations of the old dining space, we were unable to meet the demands of some of our existing customers. Guests in The Lodge were not able to find a food and beverage outlet commensurate with the expectations created by our recently renovated hotel. The available menu was limited, and the overall ambience of the space wasn't consistent with the very high quality and sophistication of the newly renovated hotel and clubhouse. Operating hours were limited in the evening as well. Things will change this winter; as NEST will offer everything our residents, golfers, and hotel guests have been missing!

In previous years, golfers were also dissatisfied and found it quite inconvenient to obtain refreshments at "the turn" (the brief clubhouse-pause following the completion of the ninth hole and the beginning of the tenth). There was no easy access to the dining area, and it was not possible to take advanced orders easily. Soon, though, golfers will be able to pre-order (whether via our new Apple/Android app or at the 8th tee ordering center) which will dramatically reduce time wasted at the turn. What's more, with the new advanced order outlets, golfers will be able to order literally anything from the menu without concern for preparation time. Even if they forget to order early, there will be a dedicated "grab & go" area near the bar that will satisfy most of their needs. Add to those improvements the new cart path and parking area that allows players to park right next to the restaurant, and golfer dining will have never been more convenient!

Golfers typically want a place to relax after their round. Hotel guests, many of whom have traveled here in groups, often wish to gather, hang out, and perhaps watch a game. Many of our residents, however, are seeking a more traditional dining experience. In the coming season, we will be able to satisfy those different interests into their own purpose-built facilities. Those desiring to watch sports, have a drink, and socialize with their friends will find the bar area the perfect place for them. With numerous televisions playing the latest games, an expanded bar area with the latest craft beer varieties on tap, several high-top communal tables, and an indoor-outdoor floor plan, the Taphouse is sure to be the center of after-golf activity. Contrast that with the comfort and relative quiet and comfort of the new dining space, the Kitchen, and you'll find the latter much more appealing to families, couples, and those wishing simply to enjoy a relaxing meal.

The strategic planning process also put great emphasis on maximizing banquet & special event opportunities since the revenue potential there is enormous. The new multi-use space will serve as perhaps the finest ballroom in the area and is sure to host innumerable wedding receptions, corporate meetings, and other similar events. Revenue will be produced both directly and indirectly from those events as hotel room nights, dining receipts, and golf rounds will all enjoy reflected benefits from additional special event bookings.

In total, and best of all, these very amenities will be available for the use and enjoyment of all residents! NEST Kitchen & Taphouse will feature dining hours from early breakfast well into the late evening, so every mealtime presents a unique opportunity to enjoy some of the best food one can imagine. Our culinarily team will finally be able to put their amazing skills to work in a kitchen that affords them creativity like never before! So, whether you dine-in, stop by for a quick break between nines, or simply choose to forgo making dinner in favor of a delicious carry-out item, everyone in Kiln Creek will soon be able to enjoy NEST in the manner that best suits them.

Drainage & Tree Concerns:



numerous calls at the HOA office for the last few months; drainage & trees. With the recent rains and possible storms, a much talked about subject has

been the drainage of our storm water system in Kiln Creek. If you contacted our office about your concerns, you already know the answers; but if you didn't have a chance to call us, I'd like to spend a moment to inform you of the answers to most of your drainage issues.

The drainage/storm water system that was installed throughout all of Kiln Creek was built to handle normal and even heavy rainfall amounts. Unfortunately, no normal storm water management system is built to handle several inches of rain in a very short time without at least a temporary accumulation of water – and the heavier the rain, the larger the temporary accumulation.

That water should clear at some point after the heavy rain, usually by the next day. We have had an unusual number of relatively quick but extremely heavy rains



this summer. With that, have come an equally unusual number of concerns from homeowners.

The procedure that we follow for any drainage concern that we receive is to monitor the area for 24 hours. If the drain is clear 24 hours after the rainfall, we know that there is not a problem with the drain itself. Just because you see what "appears" to be standing water over the drain, doesn't mean the drain is not working correctly. The drains simply can't handle excessive amounts of water in a short amount of time. The diameter of storm water management pipes can only move a certain amount of water at any given time. If that amount of water is exceeded, all of the lakes back up; which in turn, back up the drains within the community. Please know that our staff always clears off drains after heavy rainfalls; they also clear drains before and after major tropical storms. In some instances, you can also call the City or County Storm Water division for help.

I'd like to touch on two main issues we have had

Quarterly Update Continued...

When there is a tropical storm headed our way, we do contact the City of Newport News and ask for the temporary pump in the Dunhill/Shoreline Lake #8 to be turned on. When this pump is turned on, it drains the water out of our lakes into the neighboring waterways, which keeps our water levels from getting too high. The City does not turn this pump on for normal or heavy rains, but we do contact them when we get record rain and ask if they can turn it on (they are not required to do so).

There is some light at the end of this tunnel, or drain as the case may be. The City is working on installing a permanent pump which will automatically turn on when the water level rises to a certain height. This is great news for us! Soon, we won't have to rely on City staff to manually turn the pump on; this also lets them focus on bigger issues they might be facing during a big storm. Currently the City is in the planning phase of getting this permanent pump. The latest version of plans will be discussed with the ARB and Board within the next few weeks. It will more than likely take another year before we see the completed project and the permanent pump

running, but it is a great step that the City is taking and worth the wait to help aid with the drainage of storm water in our community!

Another issue we have been facing due the threat of the recent tropical storms, is homeowners being concerned about trees falling on their houses. We absolutely understand your concerns and don't take them lightly. Each and every concern we receive is looked at by the Director of Agronomy, Dave Marcus. If the tree appears to be healthy, we can not reasonably be expected to remove it. If it appears to be damaged, diseased, or dying, we will evaluate what is necessary to keep the tree from harming anyone or any property (pruning, removal, etc.). If you would like to remove a tree on your own property, please obtain approval from the ARB prior to removing it. In the unfortunate circumstance that a tree does happen to fall, it is typically considered an "act of nature", and your homeowners insurance should cover damages.

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Reminders

Storm Debris Since Hurricane season is in full swing, we just wanted to remind you of the Newport News and York County Regulations for bulk trash pick up.

Newport News Storm Debris: Newport News's bulk trash collection will collect storm debris less than 6 inches in diameter. Pick up dates are: October 9 & 23, November 6 & 20, December 4 & 18, January 2.. Yorktown Storm Debris: Please note that Yorktown does not have a regularly scheduled bulk trash pick up. All storm debris must either be: a) placed into your regular trash bin if it can fit, b) taken to the Y.C. dump, or c) called in to Y.C. solid waste to schedule a pick up at 890-3780 (fee).

**Please also note that if you have had a tree come down, you still need to submit a notice in writing to the HOA office so we have documentation in your file that the tree has come down. Please note any trees that have fallen must be cut to ground level, or ground out.

Tree Removal

If a storm comes, we will all be faced with downed trees. Although tree removals require approval, we have no control over what mother nature does. So if a tree falls due to storm damage, we simply ask you to please submit an "after the fact" application to the Architectural Review Board. The ARB will obviously not be voting to approve or disapprove this as you had no choice; it is simply the best way for our office to make a notation in your file of what tree fell and where it was on your property.

Safety and Security Tips

According to Newport News Police and York County Sheriff crime statistics from January – August, 2017, tampering with autos and theft from vehicles have been increasing in the local area. There are several things you can do to decrease your chances of becoming a victim of a car break-in or vehicle theft:

- Lock your car, even if parked in your driveway or in front of your house and even if there is nothing of value in it.
- Close windows and sunroof.
- Do not leave your keys in the vehicle.
- Never leave your vehicle running if unattended.
- Do not leave valuables in plain view (portable GPS devices, laptops, cell phones, wallet, purse, etc.).
- Do not move valuable items to the trunk while in public view.
- Do not leave the garage door opener in plain view. If your car is never garaged, remove the garage door opener from the vehicle; if your car is stolen or broken into, a garage door opener may give the bad guys access to your home.
- Do not leave out items with personal information (identify theft).
- Thieves prefer to work in the dark. Park it in a well-lit area if possible. Install security lights to illuminate your driveway.
- Clean out your garage and garage your car if at all possible; keep the garage door closed.

If an incident does occur, REPORT IT to the appropriate law enforcement agency even if there is no damage or nothing is taken. Law enforcement cannot detect patterns for targeted patrols if crimes are not consistently reported.

LeafCRemoval

It's that time again when leaves are starting to fall. We wanted to remind you that the piling of un-bagged leaves on your curb is strictly prohibited. By doing this, you are allowing your leaves to blow through neighbors properties and also allowing them to blow down our storm water drains. These extra leaves will flow into our lakes which can cause damage to our fountain systems. Please be courteous and follow the rules and bag your leaves. If it is noticed that you are piling leaves on the curb, or placing bags on the curb prior to the appropriate pick up time, you will be considered in violation and will receive prompt notice.

<u>Newport News</u>: All leaves must be placed into clear plastic bags to be picked up with bulk trash. Please do not place the bags on your curb until 5:00pm the Sunday evening before bulk trash pick up. You may also place leaves in your regular trash bin to be picked up on Wednesdays. (Only what will fit in the bin will be picked up on Wednesdays, not any extra bags.)

<u>York County:</u> York County does not have a weekly bulk trash pick up service; therefore, they schedule a leaf pick up every two weeks. All leaves must be placed into clear plastic bags. Please DO NOT place leaves on the curb until 5:00pm Sunday evening of the scheduled pick up week. At the time of writing this article, they have not set the starting date. Pick up typically starts the first full week in November. PLEASE contact Y.C. Solid Waste at 890-9780 to find out the start date for your neighborhood.



DOMINION ENERGY TRANSMISSION LINE REBUILD

Earlier in the summer, we informed you that Dominion Energy will be replacing the existing powerline towers and lines. They have already been busy cutting down "danger trees" from around the powerline areas. The next step is to take down the existing lattice-style towers and replace them with individual poles. Each pole will be able to hold more lines than the old towers. We have been informed that the project should be completed within Kiln Creek sometime near the end of the year. Changes to the Kiln Creek Rules & Architectural Standards

As you were informed in a recent mailing, our Rules & Standards Updates Committee has made numerous suggestions for changes to the Rules & Architectural Standards. At the July 27, 2017, regular Board of Directors meeting, the Board reviewed and discussed the Committee's suggestions and approved them as modified after legal review. The 2017 Handbook containing the most updated Rules & Architectural Standards is now available on our website at <u>www.kilncreek.org</u> under the management tab. If you would like a hard copy, they are available at the HOA office. Please note the guide below is not all of the changes; it is merely a summary of the ones that will have the most impact or have been significantly changed from the previous rule.

Rules Updates:

- <u>Vandalism (pg. 10)</u>: Damage to property by vandalism on common property must be promptly reported to the Association and law enforcement by any person having knowledge thereof. Remediation of vandalism on personal property must be commenced no later than 30 days after the occurrence. An extension may be granted by the Board of Directors, in its sole and absolute discretion.
- Drones (pg. 11 unmanned aerial vehicles): Due to the close proximity of Kiln Creek to the Airport, recreational use of drones (unmanned aerial vehicles) is prohibited.
- <u>Grills/Firepits (pg. 11)</u>: Grills/Firepits shall be a minimum of 5 (five) feet from the property line.
- <u>Lakes and Water Bodies (pg. 12)</u>: Owners are prohibited from trimming any vegetation on common property bordering the lakes.
- Leasing (pg. 13): No Owner shall lease a Lot other than on a written form of lease. Therefore, any "AirBnB" type of listings/postings for rentals are strictly prohibited.
- <u>Outdoor Recreational Group Activities (pg. 15)</u>: "Pokemon Go" type activities are prohibited in Common Areas.
- <u>Portable Storage Containers (pg. 19)</u>: All portable storage containers such as PODs[®], SmartBox[®] and other similar storage devices are prohibited on a Lot, except for 3 days when moving in/out, or as permitted by the Board of Directors or Director of HOA Operations for construction activities.
- <u>Paths/Trails (pg. 21)</u>: Paths/Trails are for use of residents and theirs guests. Please use at your own risk. Skateboards, hoverboards and other similar devices are not permitted on the paths/trails.

Architectural Standards Updates:

- After the Fact Fee (pg. 31): Applications for exterior alteration which are received by the Architectural Review Board after the described work has been started or has already been completed shall be subject to an ARB administrative fee of \$50 to cover the costs of additional correspondence and inspections. The ARB, in its discretion, may waive the fee. Emergency repairs will be excluded from this fee. (This was increased to \$50 from \$25)
- <u>Fences (pg. 35-39)</u>: Any new fence, replacement, or modification or addition to existing fencing requires an Application. <u>Please make sure when replacing old fences to ensure the smooth side of</u> <u>the fence is facing outward</u>.
- Fences (pg. 35-39): Fences made of synthetic material (i.e. vinyl, Trex, etc.) in place of wood will be considered if height, and style is same as current standard and the color matches the existing pallet of approved stain colors; furthermore, no white fences are permitted.
- <u>Grills/Firepits (pg. 41):</u> Permanent grills/fire pits require an Application. For portable grills/fire pits, see Rules pg. 11 for more information.
- <u>Lamp Posts (44)</u>: An application for exterior alteration is required for all lamp posts. Height not to exceed 7ft including fixture.
- <u>Re:Roofing (pg. 51)</u>: Metal roofs that conform to the appearance of traditional roofing require an application and will be considered on a case by case basis.
- <u>Re:Roofing (pg. 51)</u>: Houses sharing roofs/rooflines are permitted to have a combination of Architectural and 3 tab shingles.
- Security Cameras (pg. 51): All Security Cameras require an application.
- Sheds or Other Accessory Structures (pg. 51-52): The shed roof shall be the same type and color as the house. If the color of a roof is changed, the roof of the shed shall also be changed.
- Trim (pg. 55): Wrapping existing wood trim with a synthetic material or aluminum is permitted. Color shall match current trim color. A change in trim color requires an application.

Holiday/Seasonal Decorations

Holiday decorations mean, "...those temporary decorations and lighting associated with a particular national, state, local or religious holiday. These decorations may be displayed for up to thirty (30) days before and fourteen (14) days after the applicable holiday. Inflatable decorations are permitted for holiday decorations only, not seasonal.

Seasonal decorations may be displayed during the calendar year's seasonal dates. Inflatable decorations are permitted for holiday decorations only, not seasonal.

Owners are urged to take care and exhibit consideration for their neighbors when displaying holiday/seasonal/temporary decorations so as not to cause an unreasonable source of annoyance to occupants of neighboring property. Please contact the Association's office for special circumstances regarding holiday decorations."

Q. A.

What do I do if they missed my trash can?

There are certain times that your trash can needs to stay on the curb a little longer, or it might have even been missed during the regular pick up; but there is no way for our office to know of these circumstances. If for any reason your trash can is on the curb before 5:00pm the evening of pick up or after 9:00 p.m. the day of pickup, please contact our office as soon as possible. This way we can make sure you are not sent a notice. Trash can and recycle bins are one of the most unsightly things in our neighborhoods, yet we all need them. We try very hard to make sure they are not visible except when on the curb for pick up.

Can we still get our Rec Passes even though the pool is closed?

Yes! Your Rec Pass is for your use of all of our facilities, including the fitness center which is open all year. You can stop by the HOA office to get your Rec Pass at any time! 

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
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
