COA QUARTERLY UPDATE

Happy Summer Kiln Creek! We have a lot of updates for you this issue. Isn't it exciting news to read about the start construction to the restaurant and banquet space!?!? The Board and staff have worked very hard to finally get started on the amazing changes you will soon see. All of the events we have had over the last couple of months have also had great turnouts; including Easter with the Bunny & Mothers Day Brunch. Thank you for your participation! It is really great to see so many people come out to support their community! We've also had a lot of recent changes to our Rules & Standards and procedures; and you can also read about some other new information below.

The weather has certainly been the talk of the town lately. With all the rain we have had recently, the HOA office has received several of complaints about drainage. The flash flood we had a few weeks ago made countless yards into swamps. This was more rain in one hour than our area has seen in over a decade. When it rains that heavy, our lake system cannot handle the amount of water in that short of a timeframe. When the lakes get full, all of the drains get full; which in turn makes your yard's flood. Our landscaping staff goes out after each major rain event and cleans off the debris that has collected on the common area drains. A little while after Hurricane Floyd flooded parts of Kiln Creek, Newport News City installed a temporary pump to drain water out of our lake system during major rain events such as nor'easters and hurricanes. The City is in the planning phase of installing a permanent pump that will automatically turn on when the water level reaches a certain height. We are hopeful, once installed, this will help even with normal rains. If approved, the permanent pump will most likely be installed within the near future.

Despite the rainy weather, our pools have seen a lot of visitors due to the high heat between rains. We have had some suggestions of how to make the pool more accessible to residents and their extended families/ friends. In an effort to do this, at the June 21 regular Board meeting, the Board of Directors approved to increase the number of guest passes per household you receive each year to 10 free guest visits. We hope that this helps alleviate some of those concerns and increases your use and enjoyment of our pools! If you have only received 5, stop by the office anytime we are open to get 5 more! Don't forget, if your child has turned 12 or 16, they can come get their pass color changed for free!

As of the last issue of the Courier, we had not revitalized our Rules & Standards Updates Committee quite yet; but if you are on our Friday email blast, you will recall our office asking for your suggestions if there were rules you wanted to see change. We received numerous suggestions and each one of them was considered at the meetings. The Rules & Standards

-Laura L. Carnrike, CMCA, AMS, Director of HOA Operations Updates Committee met 6 times during April, May and June and discussed and recommended numerous changes to the Board. Most of the changes were minor, but there are a few that will have an impact on our residents. The Board will be approving the updated Kiln Creek Handbook which contains our Rules & Architectural Standards at the July 27th regular Board meeting. After they are approved, the updated Rules & Standards will be available on our website at www. kilncreek.org (around the beginning of August), under the "Documents & Forms" tab. We will be mailing you a reminder of this and a summary of the changes.

> Another recent change you should take note of is the cost of our resale disclosure package has increased to \$250. At the March 23, 2017, regular Board meeting, the Board of Directors approved all disclosure package fees to reflect the costs set by Virginia Code related to professionally managed companies. Please note that the package takes 2 full weeks (14 days) to complete. We suggest ordering your package about 30 days prior to closing. This will give enough time for the buyers to read the book prior to closing, as there is typically a contingency on the contract that allow buyers out of a contract if the HOA covenants are not satisfactory to them. If you are selling your home, our disclosure package order form is on our website under the "Documents & Forms" tab at www.kilncreek.org.

Speaking of payments, the HOA office continues to see owners who are still making the old \$65 Assessment payments each month. The Assessment payments increased to \$80 a month on January 1st of this year. We are seeing this mostly with owners who are on autopay with their own personal bank. If you have autopay for your assessments, please look into this and ensure you have increased your monthly payment to \$80.

Lastly, I want to tell you about the fountains in our Lakes. As I am writing this at the end of June, we currently have all of our fountains working; however, I am almost certain, as soon as I am done writing this article, one of our fountains will be down. Please know that although our fountains are beautiful, they require a lot of work and maintenance. Depending on the reason why the fountain is not working, it could take a few weeks to a few months for a repair to be made. When there is a fountain not working, please notify our office. Anytime a fountain is down, please be patient as we work through the process of getting the repairs made. For the time being, we hope you enjoy the sights of our beautiful community with all fountains working properly!!



ATTENTION ALL DRIVERS, BIKERS, AND PEDESTRIANS

In the last Courier, I provided a number of updates about the recommendations the community submitted to Newport News, York County/VDOT, and the Board of Directors to enhance biking, wheelchair, and pedestrian safety along our roadways and the bike/pedestrian path. Below are updates received since then:

From VDOT: "We have completed the speed study and are coordinating that with York County and Newport News to ensure we have a coordinated speed limit for the entire roadway (Kiln Creek Parkway and Brick Kiln Blvd)... The speed study should be available... after we have received inputs from both York County and Newport News." The Bike/Pedestrian Study is still in draft, but was circulated to Newport News and York County also to coordinate for the roadway in both areas. The Bike/Pedestrian Study will take additional coordination to develop courses of action that would include cost estimates as well as potential funding sources."



From York County: As for the Bike/Pedestrian Study for crosswalks, "We sat down a while ago with the VDOT folks and went over maps and aerial photos of the York County portion of Kiln Creek. We talked about different options and logical crosswalk locations and other improvements that would be needed to accommodate the crosswalks. Where we left it was that VDOT was going to go back out into the field to take a closer look at the areas we talked about, after which we will meet again to finalize our recommendations."

From Newport News: The Kiln Creek Elementary Crosswalk and Sidewalk Extension Project contract has been awarded. They are now waiting on materials list from the contractor, and will soon be doing a site 'walk through'.

For the Bike/Pedestrian Study, "Field observations on the Newport News portions of Kiln Creek Parkway and all of Brick Kiln Blvd were conducted from 9/27/16 –10/19/16... which included bicyclists, pedestrian, and traffic counts. Pictures of the intersections were also taken. School bus stops were also noted as part of the observations.

The field observations were then compiled into nine separate Requests for Action (for crossings) to include:

Between Featherstone and Featherstone South across Brick Kiln Blvd Southlake across Brick Kiln Blvd Glen Eagles across Kiln Creek Parkway One Westgate entrance across Kiln Creek Parkway Claymill Corner across Kiln Creek Parkway The Masters across Kiln Creek Parkway Dunhill across Kiln Creek Parkway Shoreline across Kiln Creek Parkway."

"These Requests for Action are not a final decision, but recommendations to be considered. The Requests for Action have been forwarded for Engineer review (in process) and once the Engineer is satisfied with the studies and recommendations, then the Request for Actions will be forwarded to Assistant Chief of Transportation for the final approval."

Bus Stop on Brick Kiln Blvd: Two respondents to last fall's Bike/Pedestrian Survey requested an HRT bus stop along Brick Kiln Blvd, likely near Featherstone Apartments. Currently, the closest available bus stops to this area are located on Jefferson Ave. at Habersham Dr. and Habersham Dr. at Chatham Dr., approximately 0.8 miles (15-minute walk) away from the current stop locations. Jefferson and Habersham are serviced by Routes 111 and 116 and Habersham and Chatham is serviced by Routes 108 and 116. Note that York County is not a part of HRT...HRT has submitted this request to Newport News.

Wow, I can't believe it is already July! The hottest time of the year. Please take precautions not to get over heated when your outside. I hope you enjoy the rest of your summer!

I am right in the middle of the 2017 Community Reviews, please check to see if your neighborhood is next on the list. We will continue with the rear inspections from common areas throughout the summer; but not all communities will get a rear inspection this year. Some of them will be done in the winter and given enough time to complete in the spring. Please remember that these reviews are conducted to maintain the high standard of living our residents have grown accustomed to. We have a beautiful, award winning community that we all want to see stay that way!

If you do receive a notice, please do not get offended, as we are not trying to offend you in any way. Many of your neighbors will probably receive a notice too. Don't forget that we are always willing to work with homeowners when an extension is needed. All you have to do is contact us. I also have residents contact me because they received a notice for work that they had already planned to do. Please note that there is no way for us to know that you have planned the work unless you tell us. Please call or email me at sherrill@kilncreek.org if you receive a letter and will need an extension for work to be completed past the specified timeframe. Please also contact me if you have already planned the work to be done.

We have provided you with a Review Checklist; please use this list to help you prepare your home prior to your review, and throughout the year. We would also like to remind you that we do NOT go onto anyone's property when doing the community reviews unless there are certain circumstances that we need to. The reviews are mainly done from our work vehicles. We look at your house from different angles, from down the street and even from surrounding streets. Sometimes we need to go on foot to do rear reviews, or on a gator to see certain items, or to go around a lake; but it is always from common area, not on your property. So be aware when checking your house for roof stains, chimney caps etc., you may need to check all sides of your home to see what we see. Please also be reminded that although our governing documents give us the authority to go onto a property if a violation is present, we do not typically do

Two of the most common violations we cite for are trash, recycle bins & bulk trash being out at the wrong time, and for flowerbeds needing to be weeded.

RASH BINS, RECYCLE BINS AND BULK TRASH



Please make sure not to put your trash/recycling out on the curb until 5pm the night before bins by 9pm the evening of pickup. If we do not adhere to these rules, you will see trash and bins out all week long.

Please also make sure to check the bulk trash pick

up days so that you do not have trash on your curb for two weeks.

Towerbed maintenance

Weeds come up in flower beds very quickly. You have to really stay on top of picking pickup. or spraying the weeds to keep them out of the flower beds. In the high growing season, this may need to be done weekly. A good way to help with this is to use a barrier cloth underneath your mulch or rock to prevent the weeds from growing through. Please check your flowerbeds regularly to see if they need to be weeded and avoid a letter from the HOA.

According to the Architectural Review Board (ARB) Standards: "Any new fence, replacement, or modification or addition to existing fencing requires an application."

Many people may not know that only a Type 1 fence (the privacy type) may be constructed along Kiln Creek Parkway and Brick Kiln Boulevard. For illustrations of Type 1 & 2 fences see the ARB Standards.

Type 2 fences, because of their open slats, are not considered a privacy fence and are the only type that may be used on Lake front and Golf course properties.

We do not allow front yard fencing of any kind.

Only one type of fence should be used on a lot unless there are special circumstances.

Fences should only be built along the property line. "Framing and posts must be on the interior of the fence, resulting in a smooth area on the exterior of the fence". As a reminder of that, when we send out a letter of approval of an ARB application for a fence, we include the following quote in the letter: "The front elevation (smooth side) of Type1 and Type 2 fences shall face outward" This standard has been in place for over ten years, but you may see some older fences that do not meet the current standard. These will have to be reversed upon replacement. People don't consider that by having the middle support bracing on the outside it allows those who want access to your yard to simple use that support to climb over the fence.

If you choose to build a fence on or across a utility easement, the fence may be taken down by the government for access to the easement at the property owner's expense; any rebuilding of the fence would be at the owner's expense as well.

Fences shall not be painted, but may be coated with clear weather proofing or semi-transparent stain. Approved colors of stains are available in HOA office. Fences facing the Parkway and Boulevard may only apply a clear weatherproofing agent, no stain is permitted on the main thoroughfares.

Fences may be built of synthetic material (vinyl or trex) if they meet the existing standards.

According to the Newport News Neighborhood Watch Organizer's Guide, "Neighborhood Watch, Block Watch, Apartment Watch, or Crime Watch—no matter what it's called is one of the most effective and least costly answers to crime. Watch groups are a foundation of community crime prevention." Some of the other benefits of Neighborhood Watch are:

Reduce the risk of becoming a victim of crime. The risk is reduced because participants are taught how to take preventive measures that substantially decrease the likelihood of becoming a victim of crime. Not only does Neighborhood Watch reduce the risk of your home being burglarized, the likelihood of other crimes occurring such as vandalism, personal assault, and fraud also decreases.

Greater access to criminal activity information. Neighborhood Watch groups are designed to keep participants informed of crime trends and patterns so you will be better prepared to spot criminal activity in your neighborhood.

Will be prepared to handle suspicious activity.

The program trains members to report suspicious activities occurring in their neighborhood and what information law enforcement will need when taking a report.

Knowing your neighbors. Neighborhood Watch promotes getting to know your neighbors so that each of you will be able to report any unusual activity if something looks "out of place" or suspicious. This means when you are away you can feel more secure about your property.

Reduces the fear of crime and improves overall neighborhood safety. Neighborhood Watch increases the number of arrests and convictions, by serving as a network for law enforcement and citizens to effectively communicate about the activities in their communities.
