In accordance with the amended Governing Documents, The Kiln Creek Annual Membership Meeting will be held this year on Tuesday March 7, 2017 at 7:00 P.M. at the Kiln Creek Golf Club & Resort, 1003 Brick Kiln Blvd, Newport News, VA (registration and refreshments will begin at 6:15 p.m). Last year we all had a great time at the annual meeting thanks to technology and a slide show presentation of our previous year's achievements. There are five (5) Board of Director positions open for the election. To be eligible to serve on the Board of Directors, Members and their Lots must be in good financial standing and must remain in good standing during the Member's term on the Board. Owners may not simultaneously serve on the Board of Directors while serving as members of any Neighborhood Advisory Board or Neighborhood Advisory Committee. Only Members who reside within the Villages of Kiln Creek are eligible to serve on the Board of Directors. Finally, Members running for elections must not be involved in a legal dispute with the Association at the time they seek appointment or at any time during their term. # THANK YOU FOR PAYING YOUR ASSESSMENTS ON TIME!

Thank you for your continued commitment in making our community one of the BEST on the peninsula!! At the November 15, 2016 meeting, your Board of Directors chose to increase your monthly assessment by \$15 per month. The 2017 Assessments will now be \$80 per month, per unit and will be due on the first of every month. A 5% late fee of \$4.00 will be assessed after the 7th day of the month. The Board's decision to raise homeowner dues was based upon the need to rebuild our reserve accounts and to implement improvements to our physical assets that will directly benefit ALL residents throughout the entire community.

By now, you should have received your 2017 payment coupon book. If you are already set up with BB&T on auto-pay, you will not be receiving a coupon book. If your own personal bank sends out an electronic payment on your behalf, please make sure to adjust the amount from \$65 to \$80. If you are not on auto-pay, have lost your coupon book and need a new book or single coupon, there is a \$5 upfront fee which you can pay at the HOA office for replacement.

Please also be reminded that the HOA office no longer accepts payments at the office. Please make your payment using one of these four easy ways:

- 1 – MAIL PAYMENTS TO THE PROCESSING CENTER to the address on your coupon
- 2 – TAKE YOUR COUPON AND PAYMENT TO YOUR LOCAL BB&T BRANCH
- 3 – MAKE PAYMENTS ONLINE at [www.kilncreek.org](http://www.kilncreek.org) using the BB&T link
- 4 – SET UP FREE ACH MONTHLY PAYMENTS THROUGH BB&T \*\*Please note this option takes 3-4 weeks to process the first payment. Please plan accordingly.

You are more than welcome to make several months of payments at a time if you wish to do so; however, please make sure to include ALL of the month's coupons that you will be paying in advance -or- cross out the dollar amount printed on your coupon, and manually write in the amount you want to pay. The dollar amount on your check MUST match the dollar amount written on your coupon or BB&T will not process it.

Lakeside, Claymill Corner and Southlake residents will also be able to make both Assessment payments at the same time; just ensure you submit BOTH coupons at the same time. ## NEWLY APPROVED KCOA POLICIES

The KC Board of Directors has implemented three new policies that you need to be aware of. Here are brief summaries of each new policy. To read over the entire policy, please submit an information request at the HOA office. Rec Center Agreement is available online.

### Neighborhood/Club/Group Use of KCOA & KCGCR Facilities

The Board approved at the September 22, 2016 regular Board meeting, an update to the previously approved policy for Neighborhood/Group/Club use of KCOA Facilities. The update provides guidance for the use of KCOA social media, reader boards, etc. in relation to your groups event. It clarifies that the use of KCGCR facilities will be at the same rate and availability as for public use. It also informs the group that KCOA will not provide any food, supplies or honorariums in conjunction with their event.

### Non-Sufficient Fund Charges Increased:

The Board approved at the November 15<sup>th</sup> regular BOD meeting, a processing fee of \$50 to be incurred to your account if we are notified by a bank that your payment has been returned (non-sufficient funds, stop payments, etc.)

### Rec Center Rental Agreement – Credit Card required for deposit

The Board approved at the December 15<sup>th</sup> regular Board meeting, that a credit card must be used to pay for the security deposit when renting the Rec Center. The deposit will be credited back to the same credit card upon inspection of the property after the event (so long as there are no damages or follow up cleaning required).

I have residents contact me because they received a notice for work that they already planned to do. Please be reminded that there is no way for us to know that you have planned the work unless you tell us. If you receive a letter but will need an extension, or have already planned work to be done, simply call or email me at [sherrill@kilncreek.org](mailto:sherrill@kilncreek.org).

Through the winter months, in addition to

follow up reviews we will now be starting to do reviews from the golf course, which is new this year. Please remember that these reviews are conducted to maintain the high standard of living our residents have grown accustomed to. We have had number complaints and requests for these back yard reviews since we have so many resident golfers. As you know we try to look at your home from all angles that we can, and owning the golf course now gives us another angle. So if you live along the golf course, you might be getting a letter this winter; but do not fret as we will give you plenty of time to do the work with any items that might be found during your 2017 spring/summer review. We don't want you to have to do twice the work. We have a beautiful, award winning community that we all want to see stay that way!

## ANTENNAS AND SATELLITE DISHES

The FCC Telecommunications Act of 1996, Section 207 states the HOA's ARB cannot disallow the installation of a device that is one meter or less in diameter, however we can regulate the location of such devices in order to minimize any negative visual impact to neighboring properties and to ensure the safety of installation.

Accordingly, an application to the ARB must be submitted to permit a record of such installation as an exterior improvement and its placement on the property. The location of antennas and dishes consistent with the ability to receive an acceptable signal should be based on the following priority list, starting with the most preferred:

1. Rear of the property below the wall level, not visible from the street.
  2. Rear or side of house, below roof line, not visible from the street or screened from view by landscaping.
  3. Rear or side of house, above roof line.
  4. At front of property or the side facing the street on ground level and screened from view by landscaping.
  5. A letter from the installation company is required if none of the above locations can be met.
- Additionally, all wiring shall be concealed behind the siding and trim, or if on a post, the wiring must be buried between the post and the house.



## **Bulk Trash Collection** *by Jim Paddleford*

Anyone who has traveled the inner streets of many of the villages in Newport News the weekend after bulk trash pick-up has undoubtedly noticed an assortment of clear trash bags containing either grass clippings or leaves, depending on the time of year. In addition to the other yard waste like limbs and bushes, old mattresses, grills and assorted old appliances. All those things that make for a visually unappealing sight. Most of us would like for our neighborhoods to be beautiful and inviting. For those unaware, the rules state that you can NOT place any of these items at the curb prior to 5pm Sunday the day before the bulk trash is scheduled to be picked up. Those who continue to not follow the rules will receive a letter stating that they are in violation and if they continue, they may be brought into a BOD formal hearing where you may be fined up to \$10 per day per violation for up to 90 days or \$50 per occurrence.

### **Newport News Trash & Recycling**

Trash: Every Wednesday-weekly pick up

\*\* Sabrina Soto of HGTV's "Get It Sold" show shares her money making tips:

- ❖ Folding tables are the easiest to set up. Throw colorful tablecloths on top of your tables if they are not in good shape. Use any large for-sale items as extra display purchases.
- ❖ Put a price tag on everything. If there are multiple components, like a box of DVDs, post a sign stating the cost per item.
- ❖ Display eye-catching products in a prominent place that can be seen from the street. A large sign indicating a \$1 table with items for sale will also draw customers.
- ❖ Group like things – kitchen utensils, children's toys, electronics – together. Run an extension cord from the garage so people can test gadgets.
- ❖ Dust and wash everything. If people believe the goods were taken care of, they'll be more likely to buy them.
- ❖ Promote pricier items, like cameras, by laying out all the pieces it came with. This includes manuals or Amazon descriptions.
- ❖ Stock your cashbox with change and have plenty of newspaper ready to wrap breakables.

Goodwill Industries will be at our Recreation Center parking lot from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. for any leftovers you would like to donate or to accept any donations from your spring cleaning.

**Q.** Can we still get our pool passes even though the pool is closed?

**A.** Yes! Since your "pool pass" is now our general "REC PASS" for all of our facilities, we are printing passes all year long. In fact, it is better to come in during the off-season while not many people are coming in. Get ahead of the game and stop by whenever you have a chance! Renters: please remember to bring a copy of your lease, and our tenant information sheet signed by the owner of the property.

**Q.** Who is responsible for plowing any snow on my street during the winter?

**A.** There are three answers to this question: 1) If your neighborhood has private streets, your property management company is responsible for hiring a contractor to plow your streets. 2) If you live on a public street in Newport News, the City is responsible for plowing your street. 3) If you live on a public street in York County, VDOT is responsible for plowing your street. \*\*Please note that Brick Kiln Blvd. and Kiln Creek Pkwy. Are considered secondary streets and it usually takes some time for them to be plowed. The public interior streets are last to be lowed.\*\*
