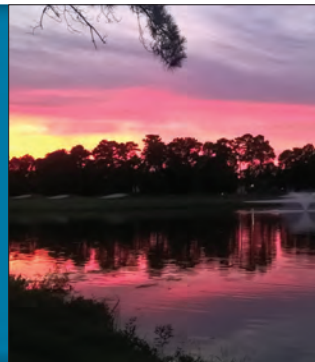

In other HOA news, we have been communicating with the City of Newport News regarding the expansion of another right turn lane at the Brick Kiln Blvd. exit onto Jefferson Ave. going north. The expansion will go into our existing easements; therefore, we are in the process of adjusting these easements, so we still have access to our entrance landscaping, irrigation, etc. When the construction is completed, you will no longer be able to go straight over to Walmart or Sams Club. There will be two left turn lanes and two right turn lanes onto Jefferson respectively. Once the easement paperwork has been finalized, the City is ready to begin work this fall/winter and should take several months to complete. We do not believe this will cause much disturbance to the exit but will keep you posted with any updates.

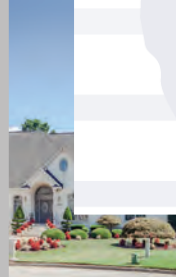

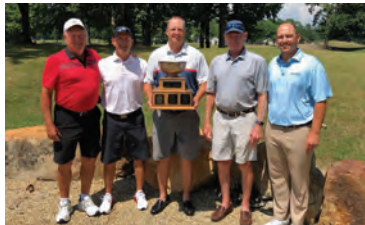

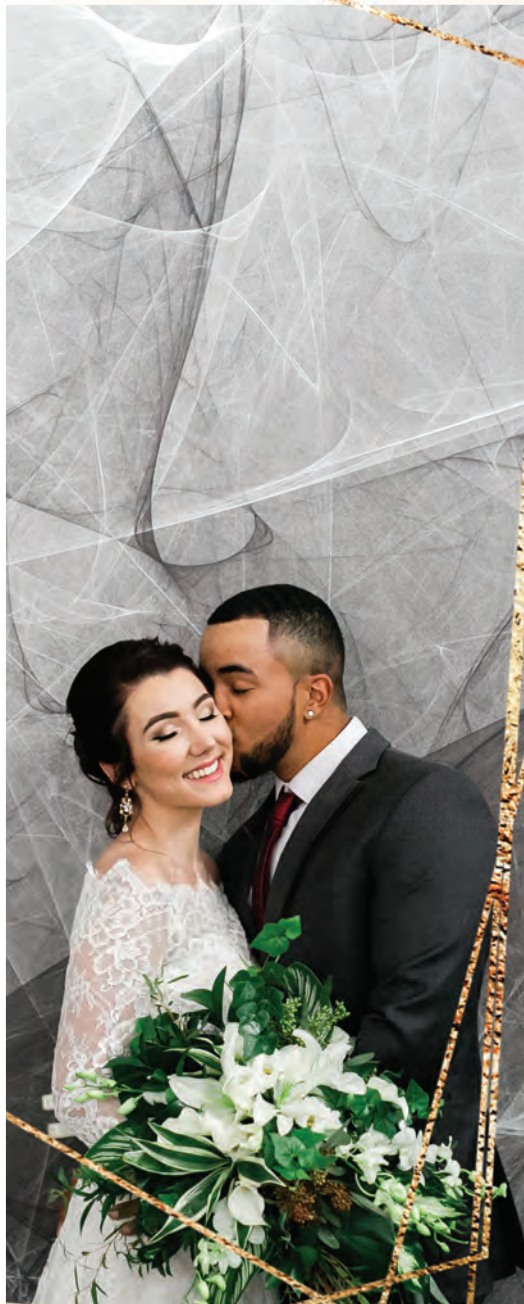

■ CHANGES TO ASSESSMENTS FOR 2020

The 2020 budget process is currently underway, and as always community members are curious of any changes to the level of assessments. As you may remember, last year the Board of Directors made a significant one-time adjustment to assessments to reflect the long-term repair and replacement needs of the Association as determined by the independent Reserve Study (a process required by law). The intention of the Board now is simply to make very small incremental increases each year going forward aimed at maintaining the long-term spending power of KCOA funds. Think of these increases as small cost of living adjustments that will remediate the natural inflationary pressures that can be expected over time. We hope this approach will bring with it a degree of expectancy each year while eliminating the need for large increases in the future.



The final 2020 Operating Budget will be approved in mid-November, and the assessment level will be approved at the same time. We are basing the budget on a 3.2% increase, which will bring your monthly assessment to \$98 per month, per lot, starting on January 1, 2020. Once approved by the Board of Directors, the budget will be posted on the KCOA website, and it will also be available at the KCOA Office for your review. Only after it has been posted online for 15 days will it be considered ratified.

So, remember to adjust your payments starting in January 2020. We will send you reminders and details via our Friday email blasts once the budget has been ratified. It will also be communicated in your BB&T Coupon book. If you are on ACH, you should receive a notice from BB&T. They will automatically adjust your payments for those on ACH per your agreement when you signed up.

ASSESSMENT PAYMENTS:

FOUR EASY WAYS TO PAY

As you likely know, the KCOA Office does not accept assessment payments. There are, however, four easy ways to make your payments. Please choose the method that best suits your needs:

1. MAIL PAYMENTS TO THE PROCESSING CENTER at the address on your coupon.
2. TAKE YOUR COUPON AND PAYMENT TO YOUR LOCAL BB&T BRANCH
3. MAKE PAYMENTS ONLINE (www.KilnCreek.org using the BB&T link)
4. SETUP ACH PAYMENTS (monthly through BB&T)

Lakeside, Claymill Corner, and Southlake residents have both KCOA and neighborhood assessments. They can make those at the same time provided they submit BOTH coupons together (showing the separate account numbers).

Thank you to all homeowners who pay their assessments on time. Your efforts are greatly appreciated!

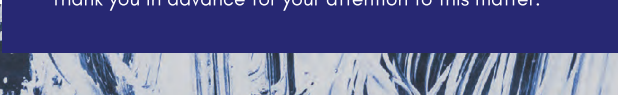
GOLF COURSE REMINDER

FOLLOW UP COMMUNITY REVIEWS UNDERWAY!

Fall is here. This is my favorite time of the year! It is not too hot outside to get things done. My family and I enjoy doing work outside and take pride in the appearance of our home, just like everyone in Kiln Creek. I understand the hard work and effort it takes to keep up the appearance of your home throughout the year. Please remember that all of our reviews are conducted to maintain the high standard of living in Kiln Creek that our residents have grown accustomed to. We have a beautiful award winning community that we all want to see stay that way!

Every year we try to improve our reviewing process. So, I am sure it is not surprising that we updated our process again this year. We start with the initial community review, then a follow up review, and a final notice review. If you receive a passed post card for your 2019 Community Review you will not receive another review for the year. However, if we are in your community and there is something that needs to be addressed, we will still send a letter. The process for the follow up reviews will follow the same pattern. You will either received a passed post card on the follow up review or a final notice with a date for completion. Our goal is that everyone receives a passed post card during one of the three inspection.

If you need an extension, all you have to do is contact me at sherrillekilncreek.org. I also have residents contact me because they received a notice for work that they already planned to do. Please be reminded that there is no way for us to know that you have planned the work unless you tell us. Communication is the key. Our office is always glad to work with you.

As of writing this article the following neighborhoods still need to have their follow up reviews which will be done by the end of November: Willow Point, Master, Royal Colven, Lexington, Ivystone, Images, Waterford Point, Pinehurst, Players Choice, Dunhill, Oakwood, Highlands, Hollingsworth, Edgewater, and Rock Creek. The Final Reviews will start immediately after the follow up reviews are completed.

RULES & ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS UPDATES

The Board of Directors approved the recommended updates to the KCHOA Handbook (which contains our Rules & Architectural Standards), pending legal review. Once legal has reviewed the Handbook, we will be mailing a letter to all owners summarizing the updates/changes. Once you receive the letter, the Handbook will be available online at www.KilnCreek.org under the "Management-Documents & Forms" tab. There will also be hard copies available at the HOA office if you would like to pick one up or have one mailed to you. Stay tuned for details in our Friday email blast.

HOLIDAY - SEASONAL TEMPORARY DECORATIONS

These may include inflatable decorations. Seasonal decorations may not use inflatables but may be displayed during the seasonal dates. We should all take our neighbors into consideration when displaying our decorations so as to not infringe on their enjoyment of their property. We encourage the display of decorations, especially the nation's flag at the entrances to our neighborhoods. You must notify the KCHOA office and give a point of contact responsible for those decorations. They may not be attached to the neighborhood's signs and may not infringe on traffic sight lines or disrupt routine maintenance of the entrances.

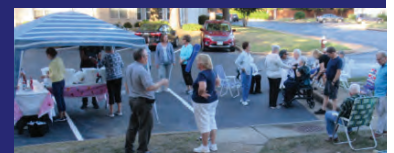

Parents, please DO NOT park at the end of the island at our entrance, it is difficult for cars entering and exiting the community, plus it blocks a driveway. Please park along the curb, thank you. Please drive safely, the speed limit is 25 MPH. I would also like to "Welcome" our new homeowners to the Players Choice community: Devin Clements, Beth Anne Ellington, Robert Ingram and James & Chong Kinney.

I do not know if you have noticed, but Players Choice is the "Community Day Golf Champions for 2019". A great big congratulations to Dave Rose, Mike Ramsey, Mike Walther and Gary Crockett (who scored a 58 by the way). A job well done!!

From your ARB Chairperson: (I know this is a repeat from last year, but we all need to be reminded).

As we prepare for the soon-to-be-here Fall Season, just a reminder about changes incorporated last year in Players Choice architectural requirements. Our driveways and walkways are slowly deteriorating and as you make decisions about resurfacing or replacing, remember that aggregate is an approved alternative. Roofs are architectural style shingles, Weather Wood by GAF. Garage door colors seem to be an issue. They need to match the color of your siding...that's the easiest and best determination. Door and Shutter colors must be the same color but can be any color that Kiln Creek approves. And that brings to mind "The Process". The Process is as follows:

- (1) Fill out a Kiln Creek ARB form and submit to Kiln Creek.
- (2) Once that is approved, send that completed form along with a completed Players Choice ARB form to Harrison & Lear. They in turn, submit it to Players Choice ARB Committee for Final Approval.
- (3) You are then notified whether the work can begin.

Complicated - not really. Annoying...sure, but what isn't these days, and we do live in a Deed Restricted community. What it does do however, is assure you that the changes that are made within the Village are tasteful and representative of the way we want Players Choice to remain. Are there folks that don't comply? REMINDER >

LEAF REMOVAL

It's that time of the year again when the leaves are starting to fall. We wanted to remind you that the piling of un-bagged leaves on your curb is strictly prohibited. By doing this, you are allowing them to blow down the our storm water drains. These extra leaves will flow into our lakes which can cause damage to our fountain systems. Please be courteous and follow the rules and bag your leaves. If it is noticed that you are piling leaves on the curb, or placing bags on the curb prior to the appropriate pick up time, you will be considered in violation and will receive prompt notice.

NEWPORT NEWS: All leaves must be placed into clear plastic bags to be picked up with bulk trash. Please do not place the bags on your curb until 5:00PM the Sunday evening before bulk trash pick up. You may also place leaves in your regular trash bin to be picked up on Wednesdays. (Only what will fit in the bin will be picked up on Wednesdays, not any extra bags.)

YORK COUNTY: York County does not have a weekly bulk trash pick up service; therefore, they schedule a leaf pick up every two weeks. All leaves must be placed into clear plastic bags. DO NOT place leaves on the curb until Sunday 5:00PM Sunday evening of the scheduled pick up week. At the time of writing this article, they have not set the starting date. Pick up typically starts the first full week in November. PLEASE contact Y.C Solid Waste at 757.890.9780 to find out the start date for your neighborhood.

*If you live in a private neighborhood, please contact your management company for proper disposal leaves.

REMINDER >

TREE REMOVAL

If a storm comes, we will all be faced with downed trees. Although tree removals require approval, we have no control over what mother nature does. So if a tree falls due to storm damage, we simply ask you to please submit an "after the fact" application to the Architectural Review Board. The ARB will obviously not be voting to approve or disapprove this as you had no choice; it is simply the best way for our office to make a notation in your file of what tree fell and where it was on your property.



IMPORTANT >

STORM DEBRIS

Since Hurricane season is in full swing, we just wanted to remind you of the Newport News and York County Regulations for bulk trash pick up.

Newport News Storm Debris:

Newport News's bulk trash collection will collect storm debris less than 6 inches in diameter.

Pick up dates | October 7 & 21, November 4 & 18, December 2, 16 & 30.

Yorktown Storm Debris:

Please note that Yorktown does not have a regularly scheduled bulk trash pick up.

All storm debris must either be:

- A) placed into your regular trash bin if it can fit
- B) taken to the Y.C. dump
- C) called in to the Y.C. solid waste to schedule a pick up at 890-3780.

**Please also note that if you have had a tree come down, you still need to submit a notice in writing to the HOA office so we have documentation in your file that the tree has come down. Please note any trees that have fallen must be cut to ground level, or ground out.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST



Food and Supplies for Severe Weather

No one wants to think about a hurricane, tornado, or other major storm system visiting your area, but it's better to be prepared to protect your home and family. With this checklist, you can ensure you have the necessary materials on hand at home.

KEY SUPPLIES

- ☐ **Water** – 1 gallon per 1 person per day. For a family of 4 for 5 days, you need 20 gallons. Save water in a bathtub for basic sanitation and dishwashing, but do not drink this water.
- ☐ **First Aid Kit** – Band-Aids, bandages, antibiotic ointment, bleach and a medicine dropper so you can create water disinfectant (6 drops of bleach for every 1 gallon of water), hand sanitizer, any necessary medications, hygiene products, and baby products.
- ☐ **Flashlight** – 1 flashlight per family member and the correct size of extra batteries.
- ☐ **Tool Kit** – A basic set of tools: hammer, nails, screws, screwdriver, pliers, and knife.
- ☐ **Sanitation Products** – Toilet paper, moist towelettes, and plastic garbage bags in different sizes. You need to keep waste away from your family and other supplies until local services like water and trash have been restored.



FOOD

- Your family needs to accumulate at least a five-day supply of non-perishable food that requires no refrigeration and little preparation.
- This includes:
- ☐ Dry cereal
 - ☐ Canned goods: fruit, vegetables, juice, soups, meats, pasta, beans
 - ☐ Nuts
 - ☐ Peanut butter
 - ☐ Bread
 - ☐ Crackers
 - ☐ Granola and energy bars
 - ☐ Un-refrigerated fruit: bananas, apples, oranges
 - ☐ Pet food
 - ☐ Baby food and bottles
 - ☐ Rice and pasta
 - ☐ Pasta sauce
 - ☐ Seasoning
 - ☐ Oats

- 3** Eat your stock of non-perishable items.
