#### **SECURITY TIPS**

9 Ways to deter crime in your neighborhood

- 1 Form Neighborhood Watch groups, which involve a partnership between residents and the police.
- 2 Trim or clear bushes, hedges, trees and other vegetation that can provide a hiding place for criminals.
- 3 Install porch, yard and motion-detector lights to supplement street lights.
- 4 Make sure that privacy fences are not providing concealment for criminals.
- 5 Don't hide valuables in popular places such as dresser drawers or freezers. Those are the first places burglars look. Use safes for jewelry and weapons. Favorite items to steal are cash, jewelry, electronic equipment and games, silver, guns and items easily sold to pawn shops, second-hand stored or on the street.
- 6 Thieves look for homes that appear to be empty, so as a deterrent, leave a car parked in the driveway, leave on radios or televisions and ask neighbors to provide surveillance.
   Most burglaries happen between 10am and 3pm.
- 7 Burglars want to spend no more than 60 seconds breaking into a home, so make entry more time-consuming by installing deadbolt locks on doors and bars and locks on windows.
- 8 Reduce rewards of crime by marking valuables with serial numbers that can make them difficult to pawn or dispose of in some way.
- 9 Make a special effort to secure the front door and first floor windows because those are the two places thieves are most likely to gain entry; Front Door 34%, first floor windows 23%, back door 22%, garage 9%, basement 4% and second floor 2%.

# How and Why Community Associations Work

The number of community associations in the United States has increased from just 10,000 in 1970 to more than 320,000 today. That's little surprise given the numerous factors that drive the continued growth of associationgoverned communities, which include homeowners associations, condominiums, co-operatives and other planned communities.



Americans have largely accepted the collective management structure of common-interest communities. The private covenants and rules characteristic of associations are not novel in residential living. Similar restrictions often exist in rental apartment lease agreements and in zoning laws and building codes that govern traditional single-family, detached housing. In traditional housing, however, such restrictions are adopted and administered by municipal governments rather than by the private governing boards composed of homeowners who are elected by their neighbors to lead their associations.



Because of the fiscal challenges faced by many municipalities, housing developments often are approved with the stipulation that associations will assume many responsibilities that traditionally fall to local and state governments. These obligations can include road maintenance, snow removal, trash pickup and storm water management. This privatization of services allows municipalities to permit the continued development of needed housing without having to pay directly for that infrastructure through the tax base.



There has been a persistent effort to increase homeownership in America, especially in underserved groups, such as minorities, women and immigrants, and in specific locations, such as urban areas. Almost from their inception in the 1960s, condominiums have tended to serve as lower-cost housing, especially for first-time buyers. This was especially true of early condominium conversions, in which apartment buildings were refurbished into condominiums. In today's economic climate, achieving affordability is a major challenge. Without the construction and operating efficiencies inherent in association development and operations, affordability would be an even greater problem.

#### MINIMIZING COSTS AND FOSTERING MARKET EFFICIENCIES

Community associations not only maintain home values but also reduce the need for government oversight. Associations avoid the "tragedy of the commons" (where no one is responsible) through mandatory membership and collective management. They also droumvent the "free rider" issue (where not all beneficiaries pay their share) through mandatory assessments and agreements between the association and the homeowners. Put simply, community associations are an efficient means of providing services, assigning payment responsibility and being responsive to local concerns.

PROVIDING AMENITIES, OPPORTUNITIES AND OPTIONS

Associations offer a diverse variety of services and amenities, from golf courses and marinas to equestrian facilities and fitness centers. Very few Americans can afford such benefits without the shared responsibility enabled by common-interest communities. People who don't want to contend with gutters and yard work can purchase homes in communities where these responsibilities are taken on by the associations. There are age-restricted communities, pet-free and pet-friendly communities, even communities with airstrips. Community associations give people options, alternatives, facilities and resources they could not otherwise enjoy.

#### **BUILDING A SENSE OF COMMUNITY**

We are, for better and worse, a highly transient society. Americans follow professional opportunities and other preferences from state to state. By their inherent nature, community associations bring people together, strengthen neighborhood bonds and promote a sense of community and belonging—attributes that are often overlooked. A large percentage of the more than 62 million Americans who make their homes in associations take advantage of association-sponsored activities like holiday events, social dubs, athletic and fitness activities, pool parties and more. These activities help residents get to know their neighbors and forge new, supportive friendships. Social opportunities exist even in smaller associations that don't have the resources or critical mass to sponsor formal activities. Many Americans make enduring friendships by serving on association boards and committees and volunteering in other ways.

DISPUTES AND CONFLICT. Community association critics often focus on issues that garner media attention, such as disputes over fences, bird feeders, landscaping, flagpoles, yard signs and similar issues. The reasons for the continued growth of associations— and the value and benefits of these homeowner-governed communities—are either ignored or

Of course, there are disputes in associations—between residents and their associations and among residents themselves—but they are relatively few in number and tangential to the actual operation and performance of community associations. In fact, the overwhelming majority of Americans who live in associations say they are satisfied with their communities.

The community association concept works—for municipalities, the U.S. housing market and the millions of Americans who choose to make their homes in common-interest communities.







Good News!! Players Choice is now a part of KC HOA, as of 12 June. 107 votes were needed to pass the resolution, which we got over that! A Neighborhood Advisory Committee will be established to liaison with KC HOA on matters affecting the PC Neighborhood.

Players Choice resident, Tricia Reyes, recently returned from the earthquake-ravaged area of Turkey.

Tricia introduced herself to our community with a post on PC Facebook you for soccer ball donations for Turkey earthquake survivors. As revealed, there was more to her story than soccer balls.

Tricia and her team of eight volunteers with International Medical Relief would transport the soccer balls to Turkey as part of an international medical force. They lived among the survivors in a tent camp of about 350 people, providing medical services and sharing, friendship, and support with Turkish families, doctors, and translator volunteers.

#### The experience in her words:

"This past week has been the most amazing time of my life. I can't put into words how much it touched my heart to see how pleasant, joyful, and generous the Turkish people are despite going through such a traumatic disaster. A teenage girl told us she doesn't have any more friends; they all died in the Earthquake. We heard so many stories about their losses, their survival, and their fear. All the buildings will need to be demolished and rebuilt as the foundations are unstable. The camp is quiet during the day; you only see women and children as the men go off camp to help clear the rubble. It gets loud at night when the men return and have playtime with their women and children. Everyone is so kind, respectful, and giving. I felt so welcomed, at home, and completely safe, even when we were lost at night."

Tricia deliberately refers to the Turkish people as "Earthquake survivors" to convey their stoicism and strength.

A clinical research professional with Johnson and Johnson Medical Services, this was Tricia's third volunteer experience with IMF. She served in Tonga in July 2019 and she and her nephew, Evan Leung, then a Westgate resident, helped with humanitarian efforts with 2019 Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas.

Tricia is now returned home to cats, Kiko and Leilani. She continues to support by raising funds to purchase a shipping container to move the providers' clinic from a tent to a solid structure there.

# ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BOARD LAKES & WATER BODIES

The Rules revised on October 28, 2021 state on page 12 section 16 titled "Lakes and Water Bodies":

"As provided in Section 7.1(f) of the Declaration and subject to the use of the lakes for irrigation purposes by the Association, all lakes within the properties are aesthetic amenities and no other use thereof ... shall be permitted."

Examples of other uses NOT allowed include, without limitation, swimming, fishing, boating, playing, or use of personal flotation devices. Any of these are considered trespassing and the local law enforcement agencies are authorized to take enforcement action without any further action from Kiln Creek HOA.

Piers and docks may NOT be built on any part of our lakes or attached to the land next to the lakes.

Lakefront property owners must observe the easement around the lake that has been dedicated to the KCHOA. No dumping is allowed into or around the lakes. Residents or owners may NOT trim any vegetation on the easement around the lakes. Refer to the "Lakes and Snakes" bulletin included in your disclosure package, provided at home purchase, for more information.

KCHOA "shall not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any person or property arising out of the authorized or unauthorized use of the lakes within the properties."

#### NO Fishing in Kiln Creek

Throughout the years, we have always been asked the question, "Can we fish in the Kiln Creek lakes?"

The answer to this is a simple <u>NO</u>. We have always prohibited fishing; it is in our Governing Documents and Rules & Standards Handbook. We also have signs all throughout the community around the lakes which state "No Fishing".

We ask that if you see someone fishing, to please contact the local police at the non-emergency number.



#### WHAT'S ALL THE CONSTRUCTION ABOUT?

The Peninsula Airport Commission has approved Virginia Natural Gas a temporary right of way easement in the field as you enter Kiln Creek (see blue areas on map below). VA Gas will be installing a new 8 inch steel gas main line along Brick Kiln Blvd to the Airport cut-off road (see red line on map below).

This project is required to increase the pressures and system reliability for the existing customers in Kiln Creek. The blue temporary easements will be used for staging equipment and material and the red line is where the pipe will be installed. This project is expected to take about 6 months and will start in the near future. As always, we will keep you updated as we know more.

The FAA has approved the Airport to sell the portion of land needed for the Brick Kiln/Jefferson Ave intersection modification to the City. The plan is to create another right turn lane, and for all traffic to be directed right or left (with no straight across to Walmart). Now that it is approved by the FAA, Kiln Creek will continue to work with the City to keep our easement rights in that entrance area. We do not have a timeline for this project yet, but will keep you posted!

There is a lot of construction happening along Brick Kiln Blvd these days. We have been keeping you posted about several projects over the past few years, and others we have just recently been informed of. We hope we can help shed some light on what all the construction is about.

#### Kiln Creek/Patrick Henry Mall Area Sewer Pipe Replacement

HRSD, your regional wastewater treatment utility, is planning a project in your neighborhood to replace the existing HRSD sanitary sewer pipelines that are nearing the end of their useful life. This replacement project will also improve the system's performance and ensure continued. reliable sewer service in the future. The answers to some Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) are provided on the back of this notice.

#### roject Overview

HRSD is undertaking a project to replace and upgrade sewer pipes in the Kiln Creek/Patrick Henry Mall area. This effort will increase operational flexibility, reduce system pressures, and improve performance within the sewer system. A micro-tunnel will be used to install the new sewer pipes under I-64 without cutting open the road above it. The remainder of the new sewer pipes will be installed in a trench. Pavement restoration of the roadways affected by installation of the sewer pipes will occur once the sewer installation is complete. The existing sewer pipes will not be needed once the new sewer pipes have been installed and will be abandoned in place. This means the abandoned pipes will be filled with a cementitious-like material so they can remain underground. This prevents more area from having to be dug up

Frequently Asked Questions Kiln Creek/Patrick Henry Mall Area Sewer Pipe Replacement

Why is this project necessary?

A. This project is necessary to increase the system operational flexibility and reduce system pressures. This project will provide upgraded infrastructure that will help ensure HRSD's ability to protect public health and the environment for decades to come

How is the location of the pipe route/project site decided?

A. We look at several routes/sites to determine what meets HRSD's needs of availability, price, property agreement terms, ease of access to the route for construction and future maintenance

#### Will the project affect the flow of traffic in the neighborhood?

A. Disruptions to traffic will be minimized, and in most cases, a single lane of traffic will be maintained. No planned detours are anticipated, but flagging will be used to help direct traffic as needed

#### Will access to properties along the route be maintained during construction? A. The contractor will ensure that access to residences and at least one entrance to businesses

will be maintained throughout construction. Trash and mail services should not be affected. If necessary, the contractor will move trash containers from within a work zone to an area accessible for pickup and will be responsible for returning them to each residence

#### What are the general working hours for the project?

A. Work will typically take place Monday through Friday from 7 AM - 5 PM; there may be exceptions in certain locations to reduce impacts to the community, adhere to City ordinances, or as required in order to complete the work

#### Will there be any interruptions to my water or sewer service?

A. Your water and sewer service should not be affected by this project

#### Will construction affect the existing pavement?

A. Where sewer pipeline is installed, asphalt, curb, gutters, driveway aprons, and grass will be removed and then restored upon completion of the project.

#### What sort of noise should I expect during construction?

A. The typical construction noises such as equipment engines, materials being delivered, diesel generators, air compressors, sawing, and associated activities should be anticipated.

#### Will material and equipment be stored on-site?

A. The contractor has negotiated with a private property owner for a storage area in the project vicinity and this site will be used for most of the equipment and supplies. The contractor will keep some supplies within the active work zone, in the public right-of way.

#### Where will construction workers park?

A. Construction workers will not be allowed to park their personal vehicles on the public streets. However, work trucks will be allowed to park within the active work zone

#### What is the cost of the project?

A. The estimated cost for the project is \$21.5 million and is financed by the wastewater treatment fees paid by HRSD customers.

#### How can I receive regular project updates?

6 URRICAN Disasters can happen at any time, and hurricane season is now in full swing. Please read the following information from ReadyVirginia.gov and vaemergency.gov to prepare yourself and your loved ones.


#### Talk to your family about the hazards that could affect your area and what you should do if it happens.

- Decide on a place to meet one in your neighborhood and one outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return to your home.
- Write down your plan and make it part of your emergency supply kit. Download the worksheets below and fill them out. Have each member of your household carry a wallet card with them.
- Texts, email, and social media posts are more likely to get through when cell networks are overloaded.
- Plan for your pets. Most evacuation shelters allow service animals only. (See more about pets below.)
- Ask an out-of-town friend or family member to serve as a point of contact for all the members of your household. Often during an emergency, long-distance calls will go through when local networks are overwhelmed.
- If you are instructed to turn off your home's utilities, teach family members where and how to turn them off. Keep tools near the location. If you turn off the gas, a professional must turn it back on - do not attempt to do it yourself.









Since Hurricane season is in full swing, we just wanted to remind you of the Newport News and York County Regulations for bulk trash pick-up.

Newport News Storm Debris: Newport News's bulk trash collection will pick up storm debris less than 6 inches in diameter. Pick up dates are: July 11 & 25, August 8 & 22, September 6 & 19.

Yorktown Storm Debris: Please note that Yorktown does not have a regularly scheduled bulk trash pick-up. All storm debris must either be: a) placed into your regular trash bin if it can fit, b) taken to the Y.C. Dump, or c) called into Y.C. solid waste to schedule a pick-up at 809-3780.

\*\*Please also note that if you have had a tree come down, you still need to submit a notice in writing to the HOA office so we have documentation in your file that the tree has come down. Please note any trees that have fallen must be cut to ground level, or ground out.
