## Reasons Why Homeowners Associations are Good:

Homeowners' associations (HOAs) can be a homeowner's best friend. Here are some research-based reasons why HOAs are good for you and your home values. You can read the full article at the website below.

#### HOAs CAN BOOST THE VALUE OF YOUR HOME.

Thanks to the targeted services and community control HOAs offer, homes in HOAs tend to sell at a premium relative to houses not in HOAs. That means that if and when you decide to sell, you'll be doing so at a higher price than you would get if you were in a non-HOA community.

- Folding tables are the easiest to set up. Throw colorful tablecloths on top of your tables if they are not in good shape. Use any large for-sale items as extra display purchases.
- Put a price tag on everything. If there are multiple components, like a box of DVDs, post a sign stating the cost per item.



- Display eye-catching products in a prominent place that can be seen from the street. A large sign indicating a \$1 table with items for sale will also draw customers.
- Group like things kitchen utensils, children's toys, electronics together. Run an extension cord from the garage so people can test gadgets.
- Dust and wash everything. If people believe the goods were taken care of, they'll be more likely to buy them.

## $\emph{C}$ ommunity Reviews Underway!!!

Wow! I can't believe I am already starting the 2018 Community Reviews! I know it seems early to be talking about reviews, because we typically start the Community Review process near the middle to end of March. This year we started a little earlier to get a head start. We will continue conducting rear inspections for some communities from the golf course and the common area around the lakes.

I conduct the in-depth "Community Review" during the spring and summer months when items can be addressed while the weather is good. However, I will continue to review neighborhoods throughout the entire year. Please remember that these reviews are conducted to maintain the high standard of living our residents have grown accustomed to. We have a beautiful, award winning community that we all want to see stay that way!

If you **do** receive a notice, please do not get offended, as most of your neighbors will probably receive a notice too. Don't forget that we are always willing to work with homeowners when an extension is needed. All you have to do is contact us. I also have residents contact me because they received a notice for work that they had already planned to do. Please be reminded that there is no way for us to know that you have planned the work unless you tell us. If you receive a letter but will need an extension, or have already planned work to be done, simply call or email me at **sherrill@kilncreek.org**.

We have provided you with a Review Checklist on the next page; please use this list to help you prepare your home prior to your review, and throughout the year. The reviews are mainly done from our work vehicles and common area; however, we do get out on foot from time to time. We look at your house from different angles, from down the street and even from surrounding streets. Sometimes we need to go on foot, or on a gator to see certain items, or to go around a lake. So be aware when checking your house for roof stains, chimney caps etc., you may need to check all sides of your home to see what we see. Please also be reminded that although our governing documents give us the authority to go onto a property if a violation is present, we do not typically do so unless there are extenuating circumstances.

## **Landscaping**

According to the Architectural Review Board (ARB) Standards (Revised July 27, 2017) page 12: "It is the owner's responsibility to keep all shrubs, trees, grass and ground cover neatly trimmed, properly cultivated and free from all trash, weeds, and other unsightly materials."

Lawns should be mowed on a regular basis and should never exceed six (6) inches in height. Weeds cannot substitute for grass and there shouldn't be any bare spots either. If you have this problem, you should be weeding and/or seeding during the next growing season. We must also remember to water appropriately to maintain a green healthy appearance. Walkways, driveways etc. should be grass, weeds and debris free. Please make sure not to blow grass trimmings into the street or onto common areas.

Inspections for high grass are typically done after the week-end. Flowerbeds and/or mulch shall be kept free of grass or weeds and mold. If the bed fades into your lawn, you will be asked to differentiate it by creating a separate bed or removing the plants and reseeding so it becomes part of your lawn. Don't forget that owners must also maintain the grass located behind their fence as well. Some owners have fences constructed along easement lines, not property lines. Please don't forget that the area behind the fence needs to be maintained all the way to the property line. If your lot is not being maintained properly, our governing documents provide for the HOA to enter your property and do the maintenance at the owner's expense. This is only for extreme circumstances, at which point we typically contact the County or City to help.

One last reminder, artificial (plastic/silk) vegetation or flowers are not permitted. Vegetation (bushes/trees) used on lots should be chosen by its height at maturity, so as to be proportional to the bed, lawn, home and lot. Owners may want to contact a local nursery for help in this area.

### ${\cal P}$ ayment Plan Policy

On December 21, 2017 the Board voted and approved the following policy regarding the approval of payment plans:

- The Director of HOA Operations is granted the authority to approve or deny payment plans on a case by case basis prior to being turned over to collections. In the event a payment plan is approved:
- All owners are subject to finance/interest fees of 3% per month, of the entire unpaid balance on their account, in excess of 30 days. The finance/interest fees will be charged to the account on a monthly basis.
- 3) Owners on payment plans shall pay at minimum by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month, THE SUM of:
  - The full amount of the current month's Association and Sub-Association Assessments, PLUS,
  - b. The full amount of 3% interest on the total delinquent balance, PLUS,
  - Any dollar amount equal to or larger than \$20 towards the delinquent balance owed;
- 4) If payment is not received by the 1st of each month,
  - The Kiln Creek Owners Association will proceed with collection procedures and any and all information obtained will be for the benefit of collecting said debt;
  - No future payment plans will be accepted by the same owner;
  - A 5% late fee will be added back to the account for months the Assessments were not paid on the payment plan;
- 5) Approved payment plans shall be paid in full within 3 years; no payment plan shall exceed 3 years.





As you make plans to travel this Spring or Summer, consider these security tips:

Leave a locked vehicle in your driveway or have your neighbor park there if you go out of town.
The United States Postal Service will hold your mail for up to 30 days. You can stop your mail in person at any post office or request <u>Hold Mail Service</u> online.
Place a vacation hold on your newspaper by calling or scheduling on-lone; the circulation department will be happy to help you.
Ask a neighbor or pay a service to mow your lawn.
Ask a friend or neighbor to check your home each day and pick up any packages left on your doorstep if you do not plan to hire a house sitter or pet sitter. Let several neighbors know

- ☐ Call the non-emergency Police or Sheriff and arrange for extra patrols for your home.
- Set up several light timers in various rooms and make sure they are programmed to turn on and off at times that match your usual pattern of room light usage.

that you will be away and ask them to call the police if they notice unusual activity around

- ☐ Turn off or unplug your garage door opener and lock the door between the garage and the rest of your home.
- Don't post your travel plans on social media sites, talk about your trip with casual acquaintances, or leave notes on the front door indicating that you're not home.

## Permanent Storm Water Pump Update:

We have been working with the City of Newport News for a little over a year trying to get a permanent lake pump installed in lake 8 close to the Dunhill side by 64. After Hurricane Floyd flooded parts of Kiln Creek, Newport News City installed a temporary pump to drain water out of our lake system during major rain events such as nor'easters and hurricanes.

The City is in the planning phase of installing a permanent pump that will automatically turn on when the water level reaches a certain height. Once it reaches this height it will be pumped out into subsidiary creeks enabling our interconnected lakes to go down faster and improve our drain system.

At this time, we have received the Deed of Easement back from the City Attorney, which will now be approved by the Board and then the City can move forward. Having a permanent pump will be a great asset for this community!

## wim Test Bracelets

In 2017, we changed the swim test rules, so that only residents with RED or GREEN Rec. Passes will be required to take the Swim Test to go in the lap lanes and deep end. Please take note, that if the lifeguards feel any resident is not a confident swimmer, at their discretion, they have the right to ask anyone to take a swim test regardless of their Rec. Pass color.

You will receive a permanent bracelet to show you have passed the test; you will keep this bracelet and take it home with you. If you lose the bracelet, there will be a \$10 fee to replace it (similar to how you get a replacement rec pass).
